Chilton Primary School School News August 2008

The last school year has been a very successful one with pupil numbers on roll going over the 200 mark for the first time in the school's history. The children have had a very exciting year with plenty of opportunities for going out on trips. Daytime curriculum trips have included visits to Steventon bakery, Northmoor Trust, Sutton Courtenay Study Centre and the Reading Museum. Our Year 5/6 children went on a PGL adventure residential trip in March and enjoyed the challenge of abseiling and zip wiring. For the first time this year, our Y3/4 children also went on a residential trip. This was a 3 day visit to Hooke Court in Dorset, where they were involved in a Roman experience. This was a fantastic opportunity to work with tutors who made history live and the children came back having been roman soldiers, experienced roman cooking and made jewellery and mosaics.

We have also had several exciting events in school. For the first time this year, each class made a guy and Mr Dodd was in charge of the grand evening bonfire when the guys were ceremonially burnt. We also nearly saw the Queen when she came to open Diamond. Although we missed waving our union jacks as her timetable changed unexpectedly, the Red Devils certainly made up for it. The school really enjoyed their display and felt very privileged to have the Red Devils come back to school for tea and the Deputy Lord Lieutenant cut the celebration cake with his sword.

On the sporting front- we were thrilled to win the Didcot Partnership Football tournament and also to get to the final of the Vale League. We have had quite exceptional talent in our football team this year. Our badminton players have also taken part in external tournaments and achieved well.

We have been pleased to work closely with our local community this year, especially Chilton Waste who have supplied us with recycled material in order to build a new garden area for our F1 children. Mr Richardson was also kind enough to come and perform our opening ceremony for us. We are also pleased at the outcome of our Safer Ways to School project. As a result of producing a School Travel Plan, we were able to work with the Parish Council and make a variety of improvements to the route

to school for children and parents. Hopefully this will encourage people to consider walking and biking rather than bringing cars to school.

We have been developing our extended schools activities and while we already run a very oversubscribed after school club, we applied for a Surestart grant and started a Breakfast Club in September 07. We also run holiday clubs during each school holiday. The uptake for both of these new ventures has been very encouraging.

With the help of extended schools funding, we have also remodelled our school website. It is now completely up to date and a very exciting way of finding what the school is up to. The address is www.Chilton.oxon.sch.uk if you haven't found it yet.

We have been successful with several external awards this year. An LEA Audit to Action commended the school as being outstanding in our approach to Special Educational Needs. We were also runners up in the county wide Trading Standards competition for school dinners, for the second time. This year saw the successful second review of our Green Flag Award, which ensures that we continue to focus on eco developments in school.

We were very proud of our Key stage 2 SATs results this year, which proved that we have very industrious and able children going through our school, as well as an excellent teaching staff. In Maths, English and Science, all the children who took the tests gained their Level 4s. The achievement of our more able children was quite outstanding in all subjects, but particularly in Science with 78% of them gaining Level 5. With our distinctly scientific surroundings at Chilton, it is good to see that the extra scientific opportunities which we offer the children are beneficial.

And finally, this year has seen the introduction of our own school newspaper. This is produced by an editorial team consisting of pupils and led by one of our parents. It is full of school activities, competitions, and children's articles and stories. If you would like one- they are available from the school office at 50p, or old editions can be seen on our school website. They are a great way of finding out what goes on at school from the children's

point of view- and they are the important ones.

Parish Council Notices Hurrah – 40 mph Speed Limit

The 40mph speed limit that we were promised at the Annual Parish Meeting in 2006 has now been implemented. The new speed limit starts on Hagbourne Hill, just after the entrance to CYO and continues to the end of North Drive, Harwell. It also means that the speed limit on Lower Road from the roundabout to The Paddock is 40 mph. The Police have said that they will be making periodic speed limit checks.



Horse chestnut leaf miner - Cameraria ohridella

Have you noticed that the leaves of many of the horse chestnut trees in the Village are

looking very brown. This is due to a moth – the leaf miner.

Experience from Europe indicates that once established, the moth will cause severe damage to the foliage of horse chestnut on an annual basis, and defoliation before normal leaf-fall in the autumn. The larvae mine within the leaves and at high population densities they can destroy most of the leaf tissues.

If you have a horse chestnut, or value one planted in your neighbourhood damage can be reduced by removing fallen leaves during the autumn and winter and either composting them thoroughly, to destroy the over-wintering pupae, or if the leaves are collected into smaller heaps, by covering them with a layer of soil or other plant material to prevent adult emergence in the following spring or by burning the leaves.

Have you Time to Spare to Meet Someone New and Help them?

Our scheme to train and place volunteers is gathering speed, and we already have a terrific team in the field. But here at the South & Vale Carers Centre in Didcot we would like to recruit more: would you be interested in helping out someone caring for a relative in their own home? You would be introduced to a household where the carer and the cared-for person are living, and asked to stay in the home while the carer took some time off: perhaps an hour a month, perhaps an afternoon a week.

This would all start off with an interview for you, and references sought, and then a short training course to equip you for any situation and send you free from anxiety into your future as a volunteer! We will take care in matching volunteers and cared-for people, and you would have constant support by phone when you need it as well as ongoing face-to-face meetings with colleagues and with Chris Elliott, the co-ordinator of the scheme.
