### 2<sup>nd</sup> Chilton Scout Troop celebrates the awarding of Chief Scout Gold Awards

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Chilton Scout Troop recently celebrated the award of a special badge to a number of scouts within the troop. Five of our scouts; Jasmine, Oliver, Joe, Matthew and Harry received the Chief Scout Gold Award (CSGA) in January. The CSGA is the culmination of a lot of hard work by these scouts. To complete the award they had to achieve 8 of the 9 possible scout challenge badges. These badges included activities such as looking at international issues, taking part in outdoor pursuits such as camping and hiking, and being competent at using penknives, axes and fire lighting. All of these skills are geared towards developing young people into mature and accomplished scouts. There were also challenges focusing on fitness and the local community so you may have seen the scouts helping out in the church yard or litter picking around the village.

To award one CSGA within a troop in a year is good work, but to award five is excellent. I think this demonstrates how

well the troop is developing and illustrates how dedicated the leaders are in providing a good programme of activities for the troop. Well done and congratulations to all the scouts for achieving this award.

### Bell Ringing Course

Would you like to learn how to ring a church bell? We shall be running a 10 week course for a maximum of 4 learners covering different aspects of ringing.

The course will include:-

A visit to the bell chamber to watch a bell in action.

Learning how to ring a single bell by yourself in several easy stages.

Learning about simple sequences using hand bells

Culminating in ringing a bell 'in rounds' with others.

The trainers will be the ringing masters from St Matthew's Harwell, Philip Roberts and Debbie Greenfield, both of whom have many years of experience both ringing themselves and teaching others.

The course will start on **Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> March 10-12am** and will continue over the following weeks with a mixture of Saturday mornings and Thursday evenings. We welcome learners from both Harwell and Chilton villages. The training will take place mostly at Harwell but we will run some of the sessions at Chilton if any of the learners live here. There will be a

charge of £15 per adult (£10 for under 18s) but this will include the provision of teaching materials including a book. ### Join Our Celebration

Chilton bells were restored for the millennium. We had a new bell frame, the tower was strengthened and the bells tuned. Our earliest bell was cast in 1623 and is still in use. Do you know of anything older in the village in constant use today? The work was completed in time for the rededication service on 7 January 2001, and the bells have been rung regularly since then.

Some of the original ringers from 2001 have left the village and we now need to replace them. Bell ringing is a fascinating activity; there are many different tunes you can join with others to ring; you meet all ages of local people and it costs nothing. Unlike golf or visits to the gym, you do not have to drive using expensive petrol, you can easily walk to the church, or get a lift to Harwell when we have a joint practice there.

We want to have a celebratory ring this year with all Chilton ringers. Why not give it a chance? You now have a unique opportunity this year to learn to ring at the special Beginners Course being organised by Harwell tower.

## New Play Area and Dog Fouling

The Parish Council has received yet more complaints about dog fouling; this time in the area of the new play equipment. The Council is aware that most dog owners act responsibly and clean up after their dogs BUT a small minority spoil it for everyone else. Please clear up after your dogs, it is unpleasant and also dangerous as it spreads diseases which can cause illness and even blindness.

It is a crime to allow a dog to foul in any public area without cleaning it up. By doing so you could face a fixed penalty notice of £50 or prosecution.
