Report of the Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish meeting was held on Wednesday 23rd April and attended by 24 members of the public.

The Chairman, Mr Thompson, welcomed everybody and introduced the Councillors. The Chairman referred to his report in the Chronicle and asked for any comments.

PSCO Gill gave the Area Beat Officer's Report. He noted that there had been zero crime in Chilton in the last month. A Speed Indicator Device (SID) has been purchased and has already been used.

The Chairman read a resumé of last year's minutes and said that the car park light had now been installed.

Mr Lamont gave the County Council report, and said that an important topic at the moment was the site for a waste incineration plant. Two sites have been proposed, Ardley and Sutton Courtenay.

Mrs Turner gave the first part of the District Council Report, she noted that the next phase of consultation on the Development Plans for the Vale was taking place. She thanked the Council for all their support on the Chilton Field Development.

Mr Waite said that he had had an interesting time in his first year as a District Councillor. He said that he was a member of the Shadow Cabinet with specific responsibility for Procurement and Waste.

Mr Tony Hadland, the Vale and Downland Museum Administrator, gave an extremely interesting presentation on the history of the Museum and the facilities that are available.

Mrs Dunsdon gave the Chilton School Report. The School has had a busy year with some very good events, a notable one being the visit of the Red Devils. The Football team and the Badminton players have done very well. The School Travel plan has helped to get improvements to the entrance to the School and lighting for the underpass. Pupil numbers have now topped 200. The School has extended opening hours with a Breakfast Club as well

as the 3C's After School Club and Holiday Club.

The Chairman reported that the Scout Group has proved very popular with all the places being filled. Volunteer helpers are needed to enable the Scout Group to keep on growing.

Mr Adrian Maughan and Mr Keith Woods were re-appointed as the two independent representatives on the Village Hall Management Committee.

Mr Morris referred to his VHMC report that had been published in the Chronicle and talked about the VHMC finances.

The Chairman explained about the Village Open Day on May 11th and hoped everyone would attend. There then followed a general discussion and the meeting closed at 9.50pm.



Good News

Chilton is getting a new bus service! The X32. Thanks to the efforts of Frank Dumbleton on behalf of the Parish Council and the Village, a new daily bus service has already started.

Thames Travel is a local bus company and in response to customer demand, the company has decided to launch a direct service to Castle Street, Oxford. This fast service becomes effective on the 2nd June 2008 and for a limited time will only cost £1.00 (Single fare - offer expires 21st June 2008). The service begins at Chilton Village and includes stops at Harwell Campus, Harwell Village and Didcot before departing Didcot Parkway bound direct for Castle Street, Oxford. The service will be nearly hourly with the first bus leaving Chilton at 07.56. This is a great improvement and it is very important that as many people as possible use the service – otherwise we will lose it again!

Any such proposal is dependent on the Village wishing to spend Parish money (capital reserves) on such a project and of course any suitable land in or on the edge of the village being available.
