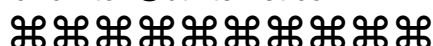

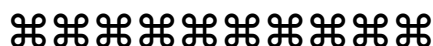
The next Chronicle is the Annual Parish Meeting edition and any Village group or organization is welcome to send in an annual report.

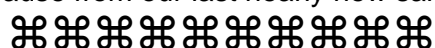
Chilton Toddler Group Nearly New Sale

Hospital. We raised and donated £55.34 to this cause from our last nearly new sale.



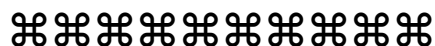
London Marathon 26th April in aid of Helen and Douglas House

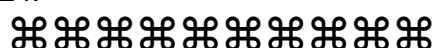
Managing Diabetes

Crafts End Green

The Crafts End Green residents' meeting advertised in Chronicle 347 was held on 27 February and was well attended. The meeting was chaired and co-chaired by Crafts End residents John Downey and Matt West. John set out the several options available and the meeting discussed the various advantages, disadvantages and possibilities. It was then decided by a large majority on a show of hands to proceed with a village green application.

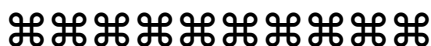
This legal procedure for registration of the land as a village green under the Commons Act 2006 can be conducted either with or without a landowner's support. The application would be submitted to Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) and in this case, to be successful, would need to be supported by a portfolio of evidence questionnaires compiled from members of the public. These would need to show conclusively that the land had been used continuously for public recreation for at least 20 years.

The landowner wanted to sell the land in question by public auction in December 2007 and while it is therefore very possible that such an application would be contested, a well put-together application accompanied by a significant portfolio of questionnaires would stand an excellent chance of being successful.

The questionnaires are not long (a few pages) but need to be carefully completed to ensure that each will count as valid evidence in support of the application, which is adjudicated legally by an OCC-appointed independent assessor. The meeting felt that a Crafts End Green Working Group could greatly help make this happen. If you would like to join this group, please contact John Downey on 01235 835827.

If you live in Crafts End, please consider helping us on this worthwhile initiative, whose success would ensure the Green remains the public open space so enjoyed by residents for over 35 years.

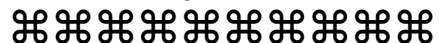
Chilton W.I.

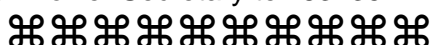
Extra ringing

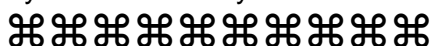


Harwell Fun Club

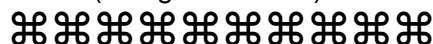
Air displays already confirmed include the Dukes of Cassutt air racing team, a newly
