#### Report of the Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April and attended by 15 members of the public. The Chairman, Mr Thompson, welcomed everyone and introduced the Councillors.

Mr Thompson said that the Village Open Day last May had been a great success and he thanked Mrs Launchbury, Mrs Gibson and Mrs Morris for all their work. He also thanked Mr Dumbleton for all his efforts in getting our greatly improved bus service. Mr Thompson referred to his report in the Chronicle and asked for any comments. There were none.

Mrs Dunsdon gave the Chilton School Report. The School continues to grow and there are now over 200 pupils. This year has seen the introduction of the Creative Curriculum with themed learning which has proved very stimulating and exciting. The School is taking part in the Comenius Project and is linked with schools in Germany and Spain. Chilton has become a Flagship School for the Soil Association is and working towards gaining the Gold Mark Award. There is an ongoing programme of development of the School grounds and the present project is to develop an outdoor

interactive science base. Offers of practical help or expertise would be very welcome.

PCSO Deane gave the Area Beat Officer's report. He noted that there had been zero reported crime in Chilton since 22<sup>nd</sup> March. Crime figures are available to the public from the Police intranet site, on <u>www.thamesvalley.police.uk</u> The Police are continuing to monitor speeding in the Village.

Mr Lamont gave the County Council Report and said that the County had received a rating of "a good Council performing well" in its Annual Audit Inspection. Mr Lamont said that after 16 years on both the District and County Councils he would not be standing again at the forthcoming County Council elections. Mr Thompson, on behalf of the community, thanked him for all his work over the last 16 years.

Mrs Turner gave the first part of the District Council Report. She noted that there was now shared management between the Vale and SODC; the joint waste contract has been agreed and there will be a substantial increase in housing developments. The start of the Great Western Park Development has been delayed because of present economic situation.

Mr Waite said that the new joint waste contract would start in June for SODC and that for the Vale in October 2010. When Verdant take over the contract a guide will be issued making it clear what can be recycled.

A report from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Chilton Scout Group was given; the Troop has grown considerably since 2007 and now has over 60 members. They all follow a range of varied and interesting programes ranging from a visit to Williams F1 HQ, camping at Goring Heath and a visit to the RNLI HQ in Thanks were given to all the Poole. Leaders and also the Group Executive Committee.

There were no nominations for the Village Hall Management Committee.

Mrs Launchbury gave the VHMC report; the annual Hall maintenance plan is now a standard procedure, the Hall website is now the first point of call for hiring information. Thanks were given to the Committee Members for all their work.

The Playbuilder Project Report was given by Mrs Swannell; following the successful application for a grant, the Group was awarded a grant of £46,000 for new play equipment on the recreation field. A subcommittee is being set up that will report back regularly to the Parish Council. The project has to be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2010.

There then followed a general discussion and the meeting closed at 9.35pm.
