### Chilton Lunch Club for the Elderly

The Club meets each Thursday lunchtime to provide old people from Chilton and its surrounds with a change of environment, a hearty lunch, and convivial company. Volunteers help with transport, serving meals, activities, and generally making clients feel at ease. AgeUK Oxfordshire covers the expenses, although a payment is collected on the day, which helps to offset costs.

Due to some recent retirements the future of this club is under threat. In particular, someone is needed to organize it. This is

a part-time post, paid by AgeUK and occupies around 4 hours a week, although a broader and more consistent interest in clients' lives and welfare through the week, can also bring great satisfaction.

### Willow Farm to Close

Oxfordshire RSPCA has taken the decision to close Willow Farm in Chilton at the end of September 2011. They advise they are looking for larger premises but why can't Willow Farm stay open until a new location is found and is ready to accept animals?

Willow Farm rehomed over 200 animals last year, some within Chilton, and it is VITAL to Oxfordshire and surrounding areas to deal with the increase in animal abandonment, lost, injured and mistreated animals.

With other rescue centres full, the future for these vulnerable animals will now be very uncertain.

### Digital-only TV

Oxfordshire, parts of Berkshire and Buckinghamshire will begin switching to digital-only TV on 14 September 2011. The two-stage process will complete two weeks later on 28 September. This means the existing analogue TV signal will be

switched off and replaced with a new, stronger digital TV signal.

Switchover is happening so that Freeview services (digital TV through an aerial) can be extended to people who can't currently get them. Any analogue television left unconverted will no longer be able to receive TV programmes after the switchover. If you already have Freeview, you will need to re-tune your TV on the day of switchover

**Oxfordshire Rural Community Council** will be running advice points in Didcot and Witney to help with any questions you have about switchover, including re-tuning, equipment and the Switchover Help Scheme.

The advice points are taking place from **10am to 4pm on 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> September at:**

- Didcot - Cornerstone Arts Centre, 25 Station Road, Didcot
- Witney - The Corn Exchange, Market Square, Witney

FixMyStreet is primarily for reporting things which are **broken or dirty or damaged or dumped, and need fixing, cleaning or clearing**, such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, fly tipping or litter, such as broken glass in a cycle lane, unlit lampposts, and potholes.

The problems are then reported direct to the appropriate local authority for action and Councillor Reg Waite will be kept informed of all incidents arising in the Harwell Ward.
