Chilton Village Hall Consultation Update

Thank you to everyone who attended the consultation events. The events were very successful with approximately 150 people attending one or more event.

To date we have only analysed the Village Hall Improvements data and as such this update will focus on this element of the consultation. We will report your views on the Artwork in the next issue.

Attached to this issue of the Chronicle are three graphs which summarise the feedback that we received.

In conclusion, the top five priorities for the Village Hall improvement are –

- Better storage facilities
- An extension to open the hall to an outside area
- Updated kitchen facilities
- Refurbishments of toilet facilities
- Improvement in the general decoration.

As a result of this feedback, we will now focus on these areas and this will form the basis of the next phase of the consultation.

The next step is for the consultation team to understand exactly what the village community requires in respect of these five improvements. This is where we will be asking for further input. Over the next few weeks a questionnaire with some more detailed questions will be sent to every household in Chilton. Please take time to complete and return this, as the more feedback we get, the better we will understand the needs and requirements of the village.

As you may be aware, we only have limited funds for the Village Hall improvements. Therefore we need to focus on your top priorities, as detailed above. We will return to your list of feedback if we have any money remaining, after your priority work has been undertaken, to provide further improvements.

There is a third graph attached that illustrates the type of events that the village community would like to see held at the hall. These are all brilliant ideas and we will consider them all. However we will need

volunteers to organise such events. If you would be interested and feel you may have the time and skills to help please contact Sue Granger at copt01@chiltonvillagehall.co.uk.

PS. One idea that received support was for a Village Shop. However, this is outside the remit of the Village Hall Committee. We appreciate that this is an idea with many supporters, and as such we are happy to set up a meeting for people who wish to create their own focus group to pursue this ambition for Chilton. Salt Bins in the Village

In recent winters the salt bins have proved to be invaluable and volunteers have used the salt to keep village roads open. In previous years bins have been filled before the winter and topped up during the winter if necessary by Oxfordshire County Council.

Unfortunately there has been a change this year and although OCC have filled them they will not refill them again if they are emptied during the winter. Instead they are simply supplying a bag of salt which is now stored at the side of the Village Hall and the village is expected to top up its own bins.

The Parish Council along with other affected parishes has complained about this additional burden, which in smaller parishes inevitably falls on volunteers, but with no success.

So if there is snow this winter it is particularly important that the salt supplies are used only on the highways.

A note about OTC

Oxfordshire Theatre Company, founded in 1979, is acknowledged as one of the foremost small-scale theatre companies with a unique reputation for taking high quality, accessible shows to audiences in rural areas with little or no access to professional theatre. The company draws communities together, promotes new writing, encourages diversity and inclusion, and challenges audiences with its innovative productions. Yet funding cuts from the Arts Council and District Councils (sadly, including the Vale) since 2009 have hit such provincial companies very hard as financial support is increasingly concentrated on the big established metropolitan arts companies. Come to this last OTC performance in Chilton, if only to see what top-quality theatre we are losing by such an urban-centric policy.



All Saints Bell Ringing

Chilton church bells are normally rung before the weekly Sunday morning service, and on some Thursday evenings when we

practise our bell handling and would be happy to demonstrate how it is done to anyone who phones beforehand to check that it is convenient with our tower captain, Alec Samler, telephone 834589. We also ring the bells to celebrate weddings and sometimes toll the tenor for funerals. Next year there are national events to celebrate such as St George's Day, the Queen's Diamond jubilee and the start of the Olympic Games. Bell ringing is a fascinating activity; there are many different tunes you can join with others to ring; you meet all ages of local people and it costs nothing. Unlike golf or visits to the gym, you do not have to drive using expensive petrol, you can easily walk to the church, or get a lift to Harwell when we have a joint practice there. Anyone aged from about 10 to 90 can ring bells. If you joined us now you would be able to ring well enough to join our celebrations in 2012. Why not try it? We also have a set of handbells which can be rung in the Village Hall or the Church and can be used to accompany carol singing. FixMyStreet is primarily for reporting things which are **broken or dirty or damaged or dumped, and need fixing, cleaning or clearing**, such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, fly tipping or litter, such as broken glass in a cycle lane, unlit lampposts, and potholes.

The problems are then reported direct to the appropriate local authority for action and Councillor Reg Waite will be kept informed of all incidents arising in the Harwell Ward.
