Chairman's Report

The building of 275 houses by David Wilson Homes (DWH) and Bovis at what was called Chilton Field but is now marketed by DWH as Chestnut Fields continues to herald the biggest change the village has seen for many years.

This development has been promised for many years but it is finally well under way with the first sales made.

A number of obligations were placed on DWH when they bought the land in the form of a Section 106 agreement .

A sum of £240,000 (this includes an RPI increase) has now been paid by DWH for improvements to the Village Hall. The consultation on how to spend this money

has been very successful and I would like to thank all those people who have taken the time and trouble to put forward their thoughts and views on how the Hall could be improved. The questionnaires have now been analysed and the information will be used to produce a design brief so that we can get architects' ideas on how far the money will go and what the improvements could look like.

Also a sum of £82,000 (includes an RPI increase) has been paid for the Artwork at Chestnut Fields. Again the consultation has provided valuable information on what you would like to see and a small subgroup has been formed to take this forward. Hopefully the views of early occupants of Chestnut Fields can be taken into account if timescales permit.

The Playbuilder area on the Recreation Ground has proved very popular and we now have the opportunity to design and build another area on Chestnut Fields. This one will be designed for older children and teenagers in the age range 11-18 and again it will be funded by a Section 106 payment. Once completed it will mean that Chilton has an excellent range of activity areas catering for all children from toddlers to young adults.

This year Chilton is holding fête a on the 4th of June to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. There is also a "Big Lunch " in the Village hall on the 3rd of June. It is some years since the village has held a fête and it is an excellent opportunity to bring people together and get involved.

The Tree on The Green

With some watering help from volunteer councillors, the new hornbeam sapling on The Green that will commemorate Queen Elizabeth's Diamond Jubilee is establishing well.

Carpinus betulus or the common hornbeam is native to Europe, including south-east England. It has a characteristic grey fluted trunk, flowers in March and bears ovate, ribbed and serrated leaves which turn a lovely clear yellow in autumn. When mature, hornbeam typically achieves a height of about 20 m (65'). A common parkland and street tree, it is also cultivated for its hard, fine-grained timber which is used to make, among other things, mallets, skittles and some of the moving parts inside pianos. It grows well on the Chalk and should in time make a fine contribution to the Main Street scene.



Diamond Jubilee Celebrations

Committee Report

The Village Hall has managed to maintain a regular hirer group of interests and although we lost the Age UK booking they are still operating purely as a lunch club and have moved to the Rose & Crown Pub in the Village.

We are pleased to have acquired regular bookings from new Zumba and Tai Chi classes.

The upkeep of the outside and the fixtures and fittings inside the Village Hall have been maintained following our annual inspection and we continue to keep the Hall in top condition for our hirers.

In December we had the production of Jungle Book by the Oxfordshire Theatre Company which played to a full house but unfortunately, they are disbanding as an entity so we have found an alternative group for our next production.

We have held our prices to our regular hirers and casual bookings during 2011-2012 and do not intend to increase for 2012-2013 as we have healthy reserves.

During the year with the new Chestnut Fields housing development comes money to be used for the Village Hall for an extension and improvements and we have held various Village Hall consultation evenings for Stage 1 and then Stage 2 for the questionnaire. We are now in a clearer position from the results to move forward with the parishioners' wishes to use the funds as far as we can to improve the size and facilities of the Hall. In conjunction with this, we also consulted on the money allocated for a "work of art" on the new housing development and we have come up with a result which will move forward based on a "Science Theme". I would like to thank all of you who gave us your views in the questionnaire and attended the events and we will publish our report on the findings of the Village Hall questionnaire shortly.

I would also like to thank all the Village Hall Management Committee for their events and support during this year.

Chilton Ringers Report for April 2011- March 2012

All Saints' bells were restored for the millennium in a joint project between the village and the church. We had a new band of ringers who had to learn how to ring the bells, as soon as we could ring

rounds, we have tried to ring our village bells for the Sunday morning service in All Saints' church every week. Unfortunately, some of our ringers have moved with their job away from Chilton and others have become ill with advancing years, which means that now we do not have enough ringers to ring all the bells. Would you like to try having a go for yourselves? Anyone tall enough to reach the bell ropes can try pulling on a rope. There is no upper age limit; you just need to be able to climb 12 steps up to the ringing chamber and to raise your arms above your head. Like learning to ride a bicycle, it takes some practice to do it well. Why not start now? Then in July you could be able to ring well enough to join us in celebrating the start of the London Olympics.

We are planning other special ringing for national events this year, on 23 April there is St. George's Day, when every tower band is asked to ring their bells for some time to celebrate our patron Saint. For the Queen's Diamond Jubilee on 4 June we plan a special 'Open Tower' in the afternoon so that you can climb the stairs to see the church clock, peer through the trapdoor into the belfry to see the bells and try pulling on a rope to chime a bell. We will also have some posters describing the history of All Saints' bells.

Visitors are always welcome in the tower to see how we ring at 7.30pm on our practice evenings, the 2nd and 4th Thursday each month. Telephone the tower captain, Alec Samler, on (01235) 834589 to check that we will be ringing on the evening you want to come.

We held a Bring and Buy when Helen Holt came to talk to us about Action for Children in Conflict and a further very successful Bring and Buy to raise funds for Garden Gate Life who support teenage mothers and their babies. We welcomed our new Rector Dr Jonathan Mobey in November.

It's not all hard work; we enjoyed a Barbecue on a dry evening in July and we were entertained by Harwell Ladies' Group in December.

Thank you to everyone who has supported us during the year. We meet on the second Tuesday of the month in All Saints' Church at 7:45pm and we welcome all visitors and new members.
