Jubilee Tree and Stone on The Green

In March this year the Parish Council had a hornbeam tree planted on The Green in the centre of the village, to replace the maple that had to be felled because it was diseased. The maple had been planted in 1935 to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of King George V, so it was appropriate to use the new tree to mark the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II.

The Parish Council wanted an inscription to mark the Jubilee for future generations, and decided that a carved sarsen stone would be the most appropriate way of doing this. Sarsens occur naturally in our area of Chalk downland, and are formed of very hard sandstone. In June the Parish Council contacted a stonemason, Joss Nankoo of Newbury, who came to Chilton to look at the sarsens we have dotted around the village.

He advised us that none of our sarsens would be suitable to carve an inscription. Accordingly we began to look farther afield and thanks to Parish Councillor Richard Beech, who has contact with a farmer near Lambourn, we were able to secure a suitable stone. To farmers, sarsens are a nuisance, because they lie just under the surface of the soil and break their ploughs. They therefore drag them out of the way and park them on the edge of fields.

The stone was taken to Joss's workshop in Newbury and the Parish Council agreed the text: "Commemorating the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II 2012". We decided not to mention the tree in the inscription, as the stone is likely to outlast

the tree by many centuries. Stonehenge is partly formed of sarsens, and that has been around for 5,000 years, so we are planning for the future.

Our sarsen is a natural boulder shape, and Joss has followed the contours to produce an informal inscription which is exactly what the Parish Council wanted. The stone was installed on The Green on 7 August. We are considering having an event in the autumn to dedicate the stone and tree in a suitable manner.

The Jubilee has been an event worth commemorating, bringing the nation together to celebrate a remarkable reign of 60 years. Added to the Jubilee events in June has been the remarkable success of the London Olympics, making 2012 something of an annus mirabilis.

You are welcome to sit your own annus mirabilis on the stone and waggle it around a bit, to polish off any blemishes (on the stone). Please note, it is high treason to allow your dog to urinate on the stone (unless it is a corgi).

Oxfordshire Dial-a-Ride

Dial-a-Ride is a door-to-door transport service for those, such as elderly or disabled people, who are unable to use, or who find it difficult to use conventional public transport. The drivers of the vehicles are specially trained in the assistance of wheelchair users and those with mobility problems.

Dial-a-Ride serves its areas on set days. For Chilton this is Wednesdays, with transport to Wantage and limited destinations in Oxford. There is an annual charge of £5 for membership of Dial-a-Ride, but journeys are free if you have a concessionary bus pass. You can get

more information or register by dialling 0845 310 1111.

To book, Dial-a-Ride members call the 0845 number, or email oxdar@oxfordshire.gov.uk, between 7 and 2 days before travel. The team will then schedule the bus in the most efficient way possible.

Please note, Dial-a-Ride is not intended as transport to hospitals for appointment. For this the Didcot Volunteer Centre car scheme may be able to help, contact 01235 816079 (the line is open 10 am to 12 noon Mondays to Fridays).



Apply now for Grants in the Vale

The Vale of White Horse District Council has launched two new grant schemes to support local community projects and local events and festivals. The Council has launched a new capital grants scheme that offers grants of up to £5,000 towards a wide variety of community projects. The £100,000 fund is available to help with capital expenditure, such as spending on buildings, extensions or equipment will be considered under the scheme. The capital grants scheme opened on 23 July 2012 and the deadline for applications is 28 September 2012.

Community groups can also benefit from the new festival grant scheme that offers grants of up to £1,000 towards local festivals or events to be held in the district. This scheme also opened on 23 July 2012 and will remain open until the £10,000 budget has been allocated.
