## Village Hall design- The Results!

The consultation evening in January proved very popular, attended by c.130 residents, their families and other visitors. Of this number 116 were eligible to vote. It was especially good to welcome some of our new householders from Chilton Field. The finalist design proposals by the Oxfordshire architect firms Stanhope Wilkinson Associates and West Waddy ADP were on display and it was widely commented that they were not only quite different in concept but also individually of high quality. However the result vote was quite unambiguous, with the Stanhope Wilkinson Associates proposal preferred by a majority of three to one.

The Working Group's recommendation that this outline design therefore be adopted has been formally accepted by the Parish Council so that Stanhope Wilkinson Associates can be engaged to take the project forward with the Working Group. Watch for updates in the Chronicle as milestones in the project are reached. Thanks to all those that participated in the public consultation that led to this very successful outcome.

## Bus service to Newbury

Many Chilton residents were disappointed when we lost our bus service to Newbury a few years ago, although we are now fortunate to have a good service to Oxford instead.

However, there has always been a minimal bus service to Newbury, with one bus in the morning and one in the late afternoon, sponsored by Harwell Campus. From 18 February there will be an additional service in the early afternoon, making it more useful for a shopping trip to Newbury on Mondays to Fridays. The buses run from Harwell Campus bus station, but will also call at the bus stop on the A4185 close to the war memorial. A summary of the service is given below:

## Flooding in The Lane

Those of you who use The Lane will be aware of a sewage leak that has been flowing more or less continuously since the middle of January. It has made this public footpath extremely unpleasant to walk on. The Parish Council has been making energetic efforts to get the leak cured, assisted by District Councillor Reg Waite, and County Councillor Stewart Lilly.

At the time of writing this report we have tankers backing up the pumping station at Dene Hollow by removing sewage by road. We are waiting for Thames Water to replace an inspection cover in The Lane, which is on order.

There are a number of fresh water springs which have started to flow in The Lane after the wet summer and autumn. These have caused a pond to form at the end of The Lane where a surface water gully is blocked. Stewart Lilly has ordered storm water jetting to be done as soon as possible by Oxfordshire County Council.

We hope that by the time you read this newsletter the problem will be cured. If you do notice any sewage leaks it is important to report them to Thames Water and not to rely on others to do so. Their phone number is 0800 714614. This is a free call number which Thames Water do not publicise. The number they prefer us to use is 0845 9 200 800, which of course you have to pay for. Even this number is not listed in the Oxford telephone directory, and this got us to thinking it would be useful to have a list of phone numbers that you might need in a hurry in the Chronicle. So we have compiled the list at the end of this edition, which we hope will assist.



### Ringling Course

St Matthew's ringers will be holding a 'Bell Ringing for Beginners' course starting on **9<sup>th</sup> March 2012**.

The initial course will take place in Harwell over a period of about 5-6 weeks with tuition on Saturday mornings and Thursday evenings (6.30-7.30pm). After that, the tuition will continue with the new ringers joining in the normal practices at Harwell and Chilton.

The aim is for the learners to join the regular band practices and, after a few months, to ring for Sunday services and other occasions.

We welcome learners from Harwell, Chilton and nearby. We are particularly keen to teach anyone from Chilton who could eventually join the All Saints' band as this is currently rather depleted.

## The Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund

The Trustees of the Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund visited some 36 of the senior citizens of Chilton on New Year's Day to distribute parcels of groceries or baskets of fruit provided by the Fund.

The distribution of these groceries is an annual event and on 1 January this year we were delighted to be able to supply some substantial gifts because of the generous donations from kind parishioners which swelled the Fund.

We always welcome donations from parishioners to increase our budget. *A little background information: Lydia Thomas was a benefactress of Chilton who died in 1807 and provided in her will the sum of £333-6-8d in 3% Consols for distribution of £10 each New Year's Day for the benefit of the poor. The endowment was administered by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Parish and used for a distribution of goods, usually of loaves of bread. It is believed that Lydia lived at the Malt House in Main Street. In 1975 the Fund was amalgamated with the Chilton Aid Fund (set up in 1955) to form the present day Fund. The Chilton Aid Fund arose from the Chilton share of the proceeds of the sale of the Nurse's House administered in connection with the Harwell and Chilton Nursing Association. That charity was comprised in a conveyance dated 1926.*



### March Chilton Market – Charity Stall

The Oxfordshire Animal Sanctuary at Stadhampton has provided and continues to provide hundreds of abandoned animals with a second chance. At any one time the Sanctuary can be looking after several hundred animals. At present on site we have 110 dogs, over 150 cats and a number of rabbits plus our permanent guests of 2 goats, 6 sheep, 1 horse and a little Shetland pony. In 2011 the Sanctuary re-homed over 500 animals into loving new homes.

*This is a difficult time of year for the charity, so come and see us at The Chilton Market on **Saturday 9 March** where we will be accepting donations for our collecting tins, pet food (for dogs, cats and rabbits), used postage stamps, towels (for use in drying animals down and/or for bedding) and good quality items for selling in the Sanctuary's shop in Didcot.*
