Chairman's Annual Report

Once again we have had an interesting year with a number of important developments for the Village.

The new development at Chilton Field is progressing well and approx 80 houses are now occupied.

The plans for the improvements and extension to the Village Hall are being finalised with Stanhope Wilkinson Associates. Detailed work is needed to ensure that the design is in budget (provided mainly by the Section 106 grant). A planning application will be made as soon as practicable and construction is likely to start in the autumn and last some six months but the actual date isn't known yet. I would like to thank everyone who took part in the consultation to decide what improvements were needed to the Hall and which of the final designs was the most appropriate.

David Wilson Homes are planning to build the Community Room at Chilton Field in the autumn so it may be available for use

while the main Hall is closed. This would alleviate some of the disruption caused by the building works on the main Hall but can I ask all regular hirers to be patient as the closure is unavoidable and we will have a much improved Hall when it reopens.

We now have a community website at www.chiltonvillage.wikispaces.com and it is proving to be popular. It is the place to go if you want to find out what's happening in the village. It is a site that people can join if they want to contribute and membership is increasing. Suggestions for improvements, new content etc are most welcome so if you are interested visit the site and apply for membership.

A working group has been formed in conjunction with the developers DWH and the Vale of White Horse DC to decide what artwork is to be installed at Chilton Field. They are taking the earlier consultation as a starting point and of course involving the new residents.

Another working group is dealing with the new Play Area for 11-18 year olds planned for Chilton Fields. A number of possible designers have been contacted and there will be further consultation.

Last summer for the first time in many years Chilton held a Fete. This was to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. Thanks go to the people who worked hard to stage the event and make it a great success. We now have a permanent reminder of the Jubilee in the form of a carved stone on the Green next to the pump.

Planning did start for another Fete this summer but owing to the other commitments of the small number of volunteers it has been decided to postpone it until 2014. More volunteers are needed to help with this and other village events and activities so if you are interested please contact one of the councillors who will be able to put you in touch with the right people.

For the last three months the village has been troubled with overflowing sewerage in The Lane. This is particularly unpleasant for those living there but also

for the significant number of people who use the path at the bottom of Latton Close. Thames Water are responsible but at the time of writing they have not come forward with a proper fix or even a timescale for implementation. Their only solution is to use tankers to ease the load on the pumping station in Dene Hollow. The tankers are themselves a nuisance as they are noisy and they are damaging the road surface. There may be more information available by the time you read this so visit the Home Page of the website for the latest information.

Finally I would like to thank the other councillors and volunteers who have given their time over the last 12 months helping to make Chilton a good place to live in.
