Bus Service Changes from 8th December

Thames Travel are making big changes to the bus timetable from Sunday 8 December. For Chilton it is an improvement on the current service, with the X32 extended to Wantage on Mondays to Saturdays. There are also earlier and later services, including an 0632 and 0730 from Chilton on Mondays to Fridays, and last buses back from Oxford at 1843 and 1943 (Didcot Parkway 1917 and 2017) which make it feasible to commute from the village by bus and train to London for a full day's work – with the bus fare far less than the cost of parking a car at Didcot station. How's that for value?

There has been some easement to the timetable early in the morning, which hopefully will make the service more reliable as it will be less affected by peak hour delays. The bus stops in Chilton village are at Latton Close and Main Street. For Chilton Field residents the buses stop on the A4185 at the shelter close to the war memorial.

We have extracted a simplified Chilton version of the timetable, **which is attached to this Chronicle**. We are also hoping to receive a supply of Thames

Travel's printed timetables to distribute with the Chronicle. If it has not arrived in time for this edition we will distribute it in January. You can also download it at http://assets.goaheadbus.com/media/cms/_page_media/468/X1_X32_Dec13_Web2.pdf

The 32 bus route, which serves Harwell Campus, is also being revamped and renumbered as X1. This currently runs between Wantage and Abingdon via Harwell Campus and Didcot. Most X1 journeys will now be extended from Abingdon to Oxford

Date for the Diary - Saturday 7 June 2014 - Chilton D-Day Commemoration and Village Festival.

Operation Overlord (D-Day) 6 Jun 1944 saw the largest armada ever assembled with the objectives of establishing a beachhead in Mainland Europe where men and equipment could be landed with the aim to defeat the Third Reich and liberate Europe. As part of this extensive and elaborate plan aircraft of No 38 Group Royal Air Force took off from Royal Air Force Harwell (now the Harwell Oxford Campus) on the night of 5 June 1944 with troops of the 6th Airborne Division who were among the first British soldiers to land in Normandy as part of the main assault.

Next year (2014) will mark the 70th anniversary of D-Day and Chilton is planning to hold a Village Festival on Saturday 7 June 2014. The festivities will be centred in and around the new Chilton Field Community Centre in order to:

- Bring the whole Chilton community together and welcome new members who have moved into the new housing development.
- Commemorate the D-Day landings, recognising the links to RAF Harwell and the Royal British Legion.
- Provide an opportunity for local clubs, societies and groups to demonstrate and advertise their activities in order to attract new membership.
- Provide an opportunity for local artists and performers to show their talents for the enjoyment of the wider community
- Above all to have some FUN as a community!!

New hire rates for Chilton Village Hall/Community Room

The recommendations of a recent review of hall hiring rates by the Village Hall Management Committee (VHMC) were accepted unanimously by the Parish Council at its November meeting. The new user charges will come into force from 1st February 2014. The VHMC, which is entirely run by volunteers, was commended by the Council for the careful housekeeping which has enabled it to hold rates pegged for almost 4 years (last review in April 2010) whilst maintaining the village hall in excellent condition for its many users.
