The Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund

The Trustees of the Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund visited some of the senior citizens of Chilton on New Year's Day to distribute parcels of groceries or baskets of fruit provided by the Fund.

The distribution of these groceries is an annual event and on 1 January this year we were delighted to be able to supply some substantial gifts because of the generous donations from kind parishioners which swelled the Fund.

A little background information: Lydia Thomas was a benefactress of Chilton who died in 1807 and provided in her will the sum of £333-6-8d in 3% Consols for distribution of £10 each New Year's Day for the benefit of the poor. The endowment was administered by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Parish and used for a distribution of goods, usually of loaves of bread. It is believed that Lydia lived at the Malt House in Main Street. In 1975 the Fund was amalgamated with the Chilton Aid Fund (set up in 1955) to form the present day Fund. The Chilton Aid Fund arose from the Chilton share of the proceeds of the sale of the Nurse's House administered in connection with the Harwell and Chilton Nursing Association. That charity was comprised in a conveyance dated 1926.

Hello, since my last update I'm sure village residents have now seen the 'Bright Idea' posters that I have been putting out recently posted around the village. Indeed, I have noticed there seem to be more homes with lights on in the evenings so I'm really pleased that residents are taking our advice and making their homes a little safer. I'm aware there have been reports of anti-social behaviour in Chilton Village,

particularly around the bus stop on the high street. PC Schmid and I have spoken to local youths about it. I will be monitoring certain "hot spots" and keeping an eye on those who have been brought to our attention recently.

It's with regret that I have to report there were three non-dwelling burglaries committed in the village. Overnight on Christmas Eve 3 sheds at separate houses were tampered with and a chainsaw was stolen from one of them. If anyone saw or heard anything suspicious that night then please call the Police on 101. Please can I also remind villagers to make sure your sheds are secure and anything of value is property marked and kept well out of sight. I have a number of property markers if anyone wishes to have one and also some "smart water" kits available for £15.00 each.

The festive season has also brought sad events to our area such is the case of missing teenager Jayden Parkinson whose body was recently discovered at a location in Didcot. Some of the investigation and search took place at nearby Upton and this of course had an impact on the community as Police activity in the area mounted. The residents of Upton have shown great understanding, patience and compassion during this difficult time. Thames Valley police would also like to thank members of the public who came forward with offers of help and assistance.

Road closures are a headache as we all know and there have been a fair number in the area recently. One such closure was the Milton Interchange on the 26th of November, which was attended by a number of PCSO's including myself and roads policing officers.

The north bound A34 had been closed due to a serious accident involving a HGV.

The road was closed for a number of hours and this caused severe delays in the area. We would like to remind drivers to be patient at these difficult times and to be aware that on these occasions officers on road closures may not necessarily have area knowledge when asked for directions.

Officers are there primarily to control traffic flow and keep vehicles moving if and when possible. Drivers stopping on a busy carriageway to ask for directions are putting themselves and other drivers at risk of an accident as well as causing further delays to the congested area. If you are lost, seek a safe place to pull over, e.g. Service station, a lay-by or nearby village. Stay calm and check your map, Sat-Nav or ask someone for directions who may have local knowledge. Or as they say on the telly-“phone a friend”. Personally, I don't believe anyone ever gets lost. We might lose our way from time to time but inevitably we do get home, though somewhat later than expected. So on that note, I would like to wish you all a happy and safe new year.

Neighbourhood Watch

Thames Valley Police are actively promoting and encouraging local residents to become Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators.

Neighbourhood Watch Groups typically operate in a variety of communities to help bring neighbours together who want to look out for each other, creating strong, friendly, active communities where crime and antisocial behaviour is less likely to happen.

A Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator (NWC) is a person who volunteers to take responsibility for up to twenty households, usually their near neighbours. Ideally, a Deputy should work alongside the Co-ordinator in a supporting role.

Thames Valley Alert Community Messages are sent to NWCs for onward distribution to members of their "Watch Group". These messages contain information of localised crime and safety alerts for your neighbourhood and surrounding areas.

With the significant housing growth at Chilton Field, Thames Valley Police are particularly keen to see new NW Groups being formed to help bring the community together. There are already a small number of groups in existence within the village and it is hoped these numbers will also grow. In due course, the plan is for all NWCs within Chilton to get together occasionally and compare notes, discuss any common trends/problems of concern in our local area and liaise closely with our local police.

Village Hall Extension News

The VH improvement working group (VHIWG) have been progressing this project (which is funded mainly by Chilton Field developer contribution plus various grants) on behalf of the Parish Council. The design and survey work was completed during the spring and summer and competitive tendering undertaken in the autumn. A building contractor has now been appointed and, subject to contract, it is hoped to start the work next month. At present the provisional date for Hall closure is 31 January, but the VHMC will keep regular hirers fully informed as we move closer to the date. With a works duration of 24 weeks, the hall is scheduled to reopen in the summer.

Community Room News

The VH Management Committee is currently progressing the premises licence and the Parish Council some building completion works by the developer that

are still outstanding. Once the latter have reached an acceptable stage the building handover can be made so that the Room can be opened for use.
