Housing

The Vale of White Horse District Council is preparing a new Local Plan to identify the number of new homes to be built up to 2031 and the sites that should be built on. One of the sites identified is the 200 plus acre site between the A34 and A4185, east of the Harwell Oxford Campus.

The proposed housing allocation is for 1,400 houses up to 2013 with potential for an additional 2,000 beyond 2031.

Chilton PCSO March/April

Hello I hope you are all well.

Since my last article in which I mentioned anti-social use of motorcycles in Chilton I'm pleased to report that an eagle eyed resident who had read my article, alerted me to the presence of two such offenders in the area. I managed to catch the two riders and they have now both been issued with section 59 warning notices.

It's great to know that people do take note of the subjects I write about in the news articles and also respond positively to them as was the case with the bike problem.

I have received no further reports of anti-social use of motorcycles and if the same two are again caught then the bikes will be seized and confiscated. I also have not received any further reports of "drag racing" near to the Rutherford site. Please let me know if you hear or see anything of this type of irresponsible behaviour near the village.

Several stables close to Chilton Village have been burgled recently and items have been stolen ranging from horse medicines to an actual shelter have been stolen. If you see anyone acting suspiciously in or around a stable/farm please call the Thames Valley non emergency number 101 or if you think an actual crime is in progress then don't hesitate to call 999.

Its saddens me to report that an incident of mindless vandalism has taken place at the Chilton Recreation ground which left a contractors digger with its windows smashed. It's a costly repair to the owner, and no doubt a loss of earnings to the operator. If you know who is responsible for this act of criminal damage then please let me know.

I'm still looking for volunteers to help run a youth club in Chilton so please let me know if you think you can help. I'm also planning a neighbourhood watch day of action in Chilton for April. This will consist of a team of canvassers going door to door to ask if anyone is interested in becoming a neighbour watch co-ordinator or would like to sign up to the Thames Valley alert system.

Chilton Bell Ringing

The oldest bell in All Saints' Chilton was cast in 1623. It is probably the oldest item in the village still in regular use today. Our six bells were retuned in Whitechapel and hung in a new metal frame to celebrate the millennium. Each bell is mounted on a wheel and controlled by a rope which hangs down from the belfry to the ringing room; it has a unique note. The ringers pull each rope in turn to make a tune. There are many tunes and we have been busy learning them.

Bell ringing is a useful exercise which takes place indoors; in these days of austerity you may like to know that it costs very little, unlike other popular activities such as golf, where you have to buy your own golf clubs, pay fees to join and often have to travel several miles to the nearest golf club.

We ring the bells for church services, for weddings and also for national celebrations such as St. George's Day. Bell ringers are friendly people and happy to help you learn to ring. It is an ideal way to get to know more people in the village. If you start now you may be able to help us ring to celebrate Chilton D-Day commemoration in June. We practise on Monday evenings 7.30 to 9pm, you would be welcome to come to see how it is done and perhaps try pulling a rope yourself.
