# Chairman's Annual Report

Another busy year for the Council and the volunteers that work to make your village a better place to live in.

Thanks to many hours work by a number of volunteers and councillors we now have an impressively expanded and extended Village Hall along with a new Community Room at Chilton Field. These are assets the Village can be proud of but they don't look after themselves and more volunteers are needed to join the Village Hall Management Committee which keeps these venues fully operational and generates income from rentals. These venues are currently self-funded and not subsidised by the Parish Council but without more helpers this might not continue.

However I think the biggest issue facing the village is development. Most people accept that villages like Chilton have to evolve and grow over the years and Chilton is a good example of such growth with developments like Crafts End, Latton Close, The Orchids, Limetrees, etc being added at a rate that is acceptable to a rural village in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, but we are now facing something quite different.

The Vale of White Horse District Council has produced a Local Plan that proposes among other things 1400 houses in and around Chilton. The Plan has to go before an Inspector to see if it is sound and the Parish Council and many others notably the AONB Action Group have made extensive and detailed representations that will be considered at the Review. An Inspector, Malcolm Rivett BA(Hons) MSc MRTPI, has now been appointed to carry out the review but no date has been set.

A direct result of the failure by VWHDC to get a new Local Plan in place before the previous one expired is a rash of speculative planning applications most of which would probably not comply with a local plan if there was one! Two good examples are the proposed houses at McCloskeys storage yard near the School and the 40 houses off Hagbourne Hill bordering on CYO. The Parish Council, the AONB Action Group and the North Wessex Downs AONB have objected on what are thought to be strong material grounds but at the time of writing there was no decision from the VWHDC on these applications.

A Science Vale Action Plan has been produced by Oxfordshire County Council, South Oxfordshire District Council and The Vale of White Horse District Council which among many other points that will affect our community accepts the allocation of 1400 houses. Science Vale is basically a concept to develop a strategy for the growth of employment at Harwell, Milton and Culham. The Parish Council and the Action Group will be responding to the plan on your behalf.

The North Facing Slips at Chilton are contentious but their construction was inevitable, leaving the Council with only one option which was to negotiate improvements to the design. Construction has now restarted after delays caused by protracted negotiations with the landowner. The work is expected to take over 40 weeks. There are many in the Village who still oppose their construction but the slips are seen as important for the future development of the Harwell-Oxford Campus and they have high level support.

For the first time in many years we had a Féte in the Village on the 6<sup>th</sup> of June. The event was a tremendous success and it served to remind and inform people of the role Harwell airfield played in the D-Day landings. It was also a great opportunity for the new and established residents of Chilton to meet. Congratulations are due to the many volunteers who made the event possible with particular thanks to one of our newer residents. Another Féte will be held this year on the Recreation Field next to the Village Hall. Once again volunteers are needed to ensure its success.

We have finally got some funds to start a project to build an Equipped Activity Area at Chilton Field for Children aged 11-18. A Working Group is being formed with members from Chilton Field and some veterans from the Village's last Play Area project. The first phase will be to select and appoint a designer. Their first task will be to run a consultation to agree a design for the Equipped Activity Area.

On May the 7<sup>th</sup> all Parish Council seats are up for re-election. The number of councillors has increased from the current seven to eight. The increase reflects the increasing size of the Village. However if only eight or less people have been nominated an election is not needed and those nominated will simply be appointed as councillors.
