Revised Bus Timetable

The local bus services were revised on 6 July. We have attached a summary of the local X32 timetable connecting Chilton with Didcot, Oxford and Wantage. Some of the last services on Mondays to Saturdays will no longer run due to Oxfordshire County Council having withdrawn the subsidy. The Sunday service to Didcot remains, which was also under threat of withdrawal.

Oxfordshire County Council is currently having to cut back even more on subsidised bus services, due to cuts by central government. It is expected that the Budget delivered on 8 July will result in more cutbacks of local government, and the possibility of Oxfordshire County Council having to withdraw bus subsidies altogether.

In the circumstances it is fortunate that the X32 buses at Chilton village are run as a commercial service with no subsidy from the County Council. However, that means their continuation depends on the amount of use the village makes of the service. With the school summer holidays coming up, the buses are a way for young people to travel to local towns without relying on parents' cars.

There is also a new Connector service between Harwell Campus and Didcot railway station which gives a bus approximately every 15 minutes on Mondays to Fridays between 6.30am and 8pm.
